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Work on Dodge Substation

Upgrades to the facilities at the Dodge substation will happen in phases in the coming months by Schmader Electric crews along with Cuming County Public Power District's assistance. Work began this week on some of the dirt work around the substation. Next week cement will be torn out inside the substation and cement will be replaced surrounding the substation. From there trenching will begin to replace old ground wiring. The old fence will also be taken out once the new one is in place. A new transformer and regulators will be updated in the sub as well.

Upgrades will bring the Dodge substation up to a 7200-volt system which will then have the same voltage of all of the other CCPPD systems. The current Dodge substation is 2400 volts.

CCPPD linemen will make a plan in the future to transfer customers to higher voltage lines. This will mean that some will need to be out of power to complete the job. CCPPD will update and contact customers at that time. This will happen after September 2016 which is the projected completion date of the current substation upgrades.

CCPPD wants to remind you to please drive slowly in any work area and be cautious of workers. If there are any updates, we will let you know as soon as we have them.
