The money collected for the fund is from CCPPD customers rounding up their electric bill to the next dollar. It’s an average of six dollars per customer per year. Around \$800 is put into the fund each month.

Area schools have received over \$50,000 and area fire & rescue departments have received over \$20,000 since the program began in 1999. Donations ranging from \$50-\$3,000 have been made to youth groups, churches, a variety of non-profit organizations, as well as a few individuals. A total of \$268,536.92 has been given out since the program began.

Think about it, an average of six dollars per customer per year has made all of this possible. We are so thankful for the customers that give to help this great program. In addition to the money, five people volunteer their time to serve on the Operation Round-Up® Board.
